CIVIL RIGHTS MOVEMENT TOUR ★ August 29 – September 2, 2019

(The background is the Alabama State Capitol Building)*

DAY 2★FRI, AUG 30, 2019★Montgomery★(B, BoxL, D)

After breakfast at the hotel, with bags packed and ready to go, we will be joined by a local Tour Guide who is very knowledgeable and was a 1965 foot soldier. Group will enjoy a morning of sightseeing in Selma featuring stops at the **Brown Chapel AME Church** (where the Selma to Montgomery march was organized and left from), the **Selma Interpretive Center** located at the foot of the **Edmund Pettus Bridge** (site of bloody Sunday), a walk (or bus ride) across the bridge concluding at the **National Voting Rights Museum and Institute**.

Box lunches will be served on the motorcoach to begin our 54-mile ride following the historic path of the famous March 21, 1965 march from Selma to Montgomery, Alabama. Upon early afternoon arrival in **Montgomery**, a local tour guide will step on our motorcoach for an overview of civil rights sites in Montgomery, including the **Civil Rights Memorial Center** (homage to 41 Civil Rights Martyrs), **Rosa Parks Library and Museum**, **Dexter Avenue King Memorial Baptist Church** (starting point of the King-led Montgomery bus boycott), **Dexter Avenue Parsonage** (where King and his wife Coretta Scott King lived), **street corner where Rosa Parks boarded the bus in 1955** and later refused to give up her seat), **Alabama State Capitol** (destination of the Selma to Montgomery march), and the **Freedom Riders Museum**. At 3:30 pm our tour will conclude at the **National Memorial for Peace and Justice** (also known as the **Alabama Slavery and Lynching Memorial Museum**) for a self-guided tour. Afterwards, tour members can visit the **Legacy Museum** (open until 7:30 pm) and the Gift Shop and Book Store (open until 8:00 pm). Dinner is included tonight. Overnight in Montgomery, AL.

DAY 3★SAT, AUG 31, 2019★Birmingham★ (B, L)

After breakfast at the hotel, with bags packed and ready to go, our motorcoach leaves Montgomery for Birmingham (approx.1.5 hours ride). Upon arrival in Birmingham, a local tour guide will join us for a full-day of touring featuring the **Birmingham Civil Rights National Monument** (where civil rights history was

made), the colored Masonic Temple, St. Paul United Methodist Church, 4th Avenue Business District (formerly a black business district), Kelly Ingram Park, the Alabama Jazz Hall of Fame, the **Angela Davis home**, and the luxurious residential neighborhoods of Birmingham. The tour will stop at the **Bethel Baptist Church**, **16th Street Baptist Church**, and the **Birmingham Civil Rights Institute**, which chronicles the American Civil Rights Movement from the late 1800s to the present. Lunch is provided at Dreamland BBQ. Dinner and evening is on your own. Overnight in Birmingham, AL at the historic Tutwiler.

DAY 4★SUN, SEP 1, 2019★ Memphis/Little Rock ★ (B, D)

After breakfast at the hotel, with bags packed and ready to go, our motorcoach leaves Birmingham for Memphis (approx. 3.5 hours ride). Arrival in Memphis at 12:00 pm at the **National Civil Rights Museum at the Lorraine Motel**, a member of the Smithsonian affiliation. Tour members will have plenty of time to tour the museum and enjoy lunch on own at nearby restaurants. At 4:00 pm tour continues to Little Rock, AR (approx. 2 hours ride). Late arrival and check in to hotel. Afterwards, group will leave for a Three-Course "Farewell Dinner." Overnight in Little Rock, AR.

DAY 5★MON, SEP 2, 2019★Little Rock/Dallas★ (B)

After breakfast at the hotel, with bags packed and ready to go, our motorcoach leaves with our local tour guide for a half-day touring featuring the **Little Rock Central High School National Park** and **National Historic Site**, and the **Little Rock Nine Memorial** at the State Capitol, the **Mosaic Templars Cultural Center**, the **Daisy Bates home** and more. The tour concludes at midday and group will enjoy lunch on your own before leaving for home. Anticipated arrival back in Dallas is approximately 7:00 pm.

**The Alabama State Capitol Building was the destination of the Selma-to-Montgomery march, and the site where MLK delivered his "How Long, Not Long" speech.*
